ORDINANCE 22 HEADSHIP OF FACULTIES

1. Appointment of heads of Faculties

- 1. Each Faculty, as the Academic Unit recognised by Council under Statute 7 as having primary responsibilities, shall have a head who is appointed by Council following an internal recruitment process or, with the agreement of the Vice-Chancellor, an external recruitment process.
- 2. The procedure for appointing a head of a Faculty and the associated terms of office shall be the same as that of a Pro Vice-Chancellor.
- 3. In addition to the duties as the head of a Faculty, the Vice-Chancellor may assign to a head of a Faculty on appointment the leadership of a cross-University initiative, project or strategic responsibility, which may change periodically.

2. <u>Duties of the head of a Faculty</u>

To be responsible for the leadership and strategic development of the Faculty in accordance with the strategy and policies of the University. Key responsibilities shall include:

- 1. Responsibility within the Faculty for strategic development, financial / business planning and resource allocation, delivering financial sustainability over the short, medium and long term;
- 2. Successful innovation in programme design and delivery, knowledge transfer and applied research, and in providing a world-leading student experience;
- 3. Leading external engagement with relevant partners and stakeholders, with a focus on growing reputation, impact and income;
- 4. To grow research grant income for the Faculty and develop world class research;
- 5. Provide a supportive, high performing academic environment empowering staff to identify and act on opportunities;
- 6. Manage staff recruit, retain and develop staff to achieve excellence;
- 7. Monitor and be responsible for quality of teaching and learning processes within the Faculty;
- 8. Supporting the development of Welsh-medium scholarship and teaching, in alignment with the University and Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol targets;
